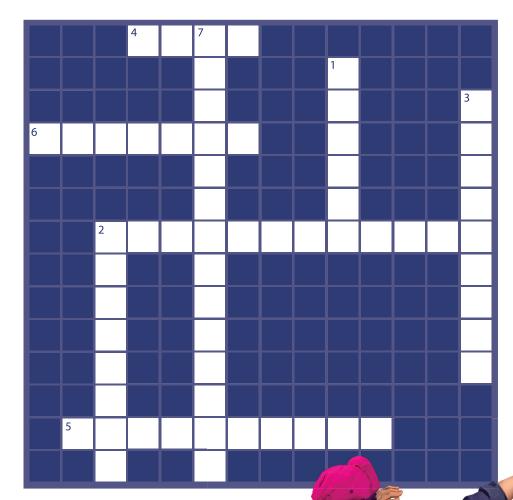

HELMET SIGNALS DISTRACTIONS

REFLECTIVE GEAR

- 1. Anytime you ride a bike or scooter, you should wear one of these.
- 2. (ACROSS) You need to put all of these away, such as your phone, so that you are paying attention when crossing the street.
- 2. (DOWN) This is what a car drives down from its garage. You want to treat it like a street and check for cars, looking both ways, before moving forward.
- 3. Always use one of these when crossing the road.
- 4. This is what you stop at to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- 5. When you cross the street where you are not supposed to, this is called ______. Instead of doing this, you should cross the street at a crosswalk.
- 6. Look for these to tell you when it is safe to cross a busy intersection.



7. You should wear this when it is dark or rainy outside to help drivers see you. (Do not use a space between the words)

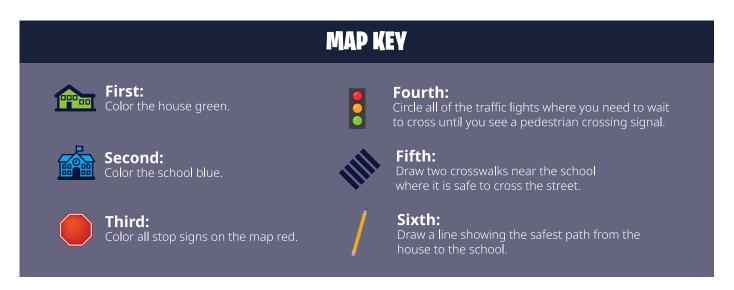

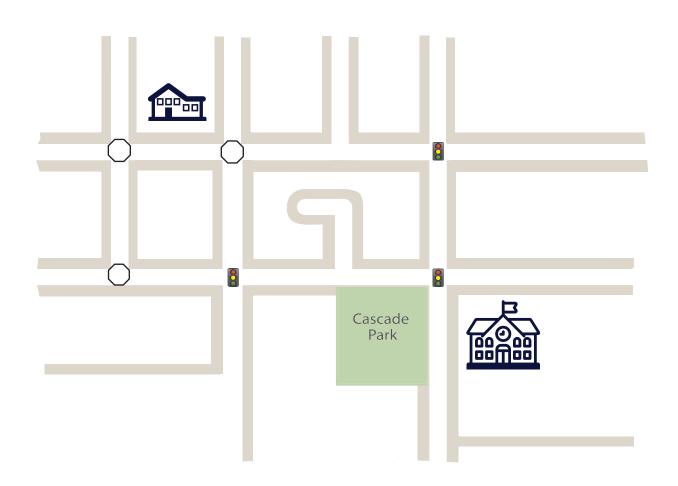
